Goals of the HIV Clinical Training Program

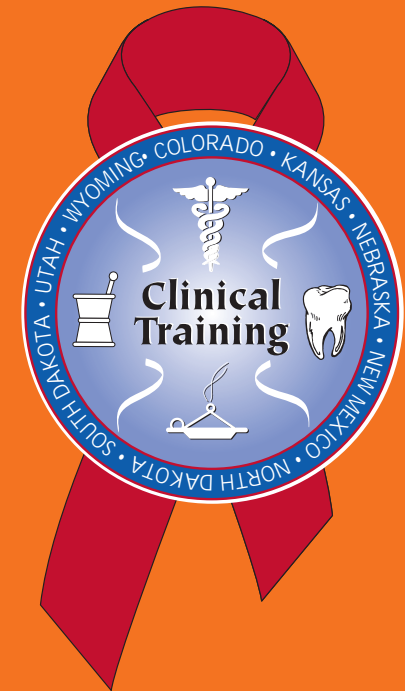

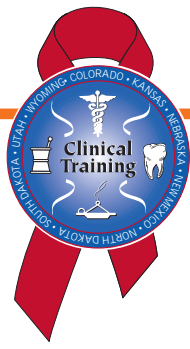

Training Objectives

Upon completion of the HIV Clinical Training Program, practitioners should be able to:

- Perform HIV risk assessment and risk-reduction counseling;
- Assist patients in making testing-counseling decisions
- Conduct initial evaluation and follow-up of patients in early stages of HIV infection;
- Recognize and treat early symptoms and common manifestations of HIV infection;
- Refer patients to appropriate HIV health care resources.

Registration and Fees

Registration fee for the complete training session is \$75.00. Participant travel to and from Denver, lodging over the course of the training, and per diem can be supported through the MPAETC. Travel arrangements will be made upon registration confirmation. To register, complete the assessment information and attached registration form as thoroughly as possible to enable individualization of the experience. Submit completed form and \$75.00 registration fee as indicated. Once this is received, participants will be contacted to confirm registration and begin travel planning.

Individuals who provide services through Ryan White CARE Act Title program or other federally-funded clinical programs (IHS, community health centers, etc.) may register at a reduced rate. Please call for information.
